



CHANNEL 7 MEDIA NETWORK FOR CHRIST BROADCASTING POLICY

1. Channel 7 offers leaders and other members of the church who agree with the Statement the opportunity to participate in spreading the Word of God through messages, testimonials, song, music, etc.
2. Channel 7 wants to serve the Church of Jesus Christ and will always strive to bring people closer to the Word and to stimulate spiritual growth.
3. Interviews with people from churches may not be used as an opportunity to promote or put down certain churches.
4. The following should be kept in mind during broadcasts at all times:
 - 4.1. It should fall within the mission of Channel 7.
 - 4.2. Statements made on the grounds of prophecies, dreams, visions, etc. will be handled with sensitivity.
 - 4.3. Controversial and dogmatic conflict areas must be avoided.
 - 4.4. The truth of God's Word must be taught without hesitance and statements that contradict the basic truths of the Word should be refuted.
 - 4.5. Preaching of the Gospel will only be done by people who have the recognition and support of their specific church to do so.
 - 4.6. Proselytising for any church or action will not be allowed.
 - 4.7. No form of racism will be broadcast.
 - 4.8. Topics on which listeners may disagree, like karate, make-up, alcohol, drugs and exorcism must be handled with great sensitivity.
 - 4.9. People and actions that could cause controversy will only be allowed in broadcasts with the written permission of the executive committee.
 - 4.10. No harmful criticism against churches, groups or organizations will be tolerated.
5. Channel 7 reserves the right to select and edit all programmes according to its Policy and Declaration of Faith.
6. All the presenters and participants must agree with Channel 7's Declaration of Faith and be well aware of the Broadcasting Policy.
7. The music that is played must be in line with the Declaration of Faith.
 - 7.1. The content should be scriptural.
 - 7.2. The words must be clearly audible.
8. Channel 7 strives for excellence in terms of content, presentation and technical quality of broadcasts.
9. The executive committee of the directorate will take final decisions should there be any doubt regarding a broadcast, presenter or presentation.
10. Our broadcasts are both spiritual and secular in nature, because we believe that we are not of this world but in this world, and we want to carry out our testimony without alienating ourselves from life.
